Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 2, 2026

Jeremiah exposes the falsehood of Hananiah. Peter fails to place his trust and faith in Jesus.

Theme: What Do You Do When You Are in Pain or in Grief of the Loss of a Loved One?

18th Sunday of Ordinary Time Year A, August 2, 2026

First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-3, Second Reading: Romans 8:35, 37-39, Gospel: Matthew 14:13-21

Today's Gospel presents us with the compassion of Jesus that moved him to cure the sick and feed the hungry who were looking for him. Thus, his compassion is a typical demonstration of love for us at every moment even when he is in pain, tired or in agony. We are also called to show compassion to others even when the troubles and pain of life attempt to stop us from that.

When we are confronted with the news of any sad event, especially of the loss of a loved one we should seek a lonely place and be with God alone. The reasons are when we are in a state of grief or forlorn by a sad event, most often we are vulnerable and the devil can use that period to enter into our hearts and minds with all kinds of negative thoughts and ideas that can destroy us even as a person. Secondly, when we are in a state of grief at times, we lack a clear mind to process certain things that have happened or are happening with us, therefore, it is only by going closer and being alone with God can one receive an inspiration from God that can

help us make a good decision and good judgment at that moment.

The lesson we can take from the action of Jesus is how he did not allow his grief or the sad situation of John the Baptist's death to create a barrier between him and the people. He was still in the desert reflecting on the death of John the Baptist when the people came to him and he cured those of them who were sick and went ahead to feed them because they were hungry. The other lesson it teaches us is to not allow our grief or sad situation to be transferred to those around us.

Let not our ugly situation separate us from God and one another. This is in line with Paul's injunction in the second reading where he says that nothing would ever separate us from the love of God. And Paul went ahead to ask, "What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, of famine or nakedness or peril, or the sword cut us off from the love of God?"

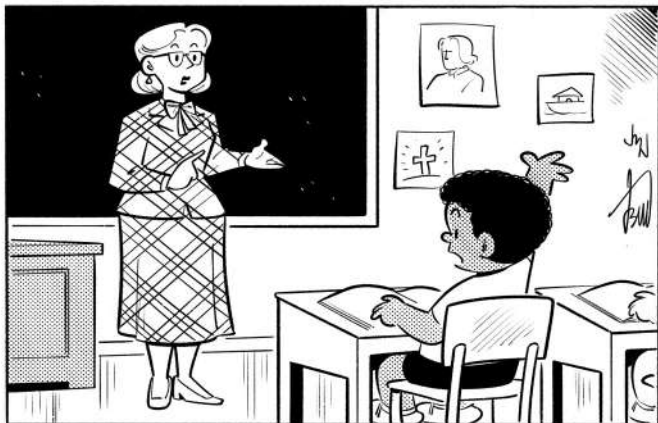

The Miracles We Don't See

"Why aren't there miracles anymore?"

I've heard people say this more than once. Usually, it is someone who is a believer in Christ but not a Catholic, because Catholics understand that miracles happen at every Mass, to say nothing of the other miracles the Church recognizes. But even some Catholics often find themselves wondering why it's been so long since God gave us a good show. A good sundance in the sky. A good, flashy reason to believe.

I don't know what it looked like when the loaves and the fishes were multiplied. I believe it happened, and I have envisioned it often, but I just can't picture it. Did everyone blink and there was a giant pile of food? Did they just keep finding more? Was it all the same kind of bread, or did Jesus mix it up?

I think the Gospel is deliberately vague on this to test the patience of pathologically nosy people like myself. It's not important what it looked like. If those details mattered, they would be spelled out in Scripture.

How often we find ourselves unsatisfied with the answers God has for us.

I wonder if that's what Christ was thinking when he savored those last few minutes of solitude on the boat, where he had gone to be alone after hearing the crushing news of his cousin's execution. Was he imagining the crowds gathering on shore? Was he contemplating their enormous expectations for God — for him! — and anticipating their disappointment when every wish could not be granted?

Maybe. But that's not what the Scripture says.

"His heart was moved with pity," we are told. I think of him looking at them all, so weary and uncertain and hungry. Pity — this is what he felt. Not resentment, exhaustion or frustration. Pity. And his precious heart was moved.

What a miracle. No details, no explanation. No dancing sun. But what a miracle.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

If God is eternal and infinite, how can He have a mother? Why don't we call Mary just the mother of Jesus?

Answer:

The title of "Mary, Mother of God" can be confusing. We aren't implying that Mary existed from eternity or that she is divine herself. We aren't promoting some kind of Marian superpowers. The Church has fought for this title throughout the centuries for one simple reason: Christ's identity is at stake.

As the Church grew in the early centuries, theologians wrestled with what it meant for Jesus to be both God and man. Many distortions of his identity began to emerge. One of these was propagated by a man named Nestorius. Nestorius and his followers denied that Jesus' human nature and his divine nature were inseparable. Following that logic, Mary could have only conceived Jesus' *human* nature. But people don't give birth to a "nature." They give birth to a whole person. For Jesus, his whole person is both human and divine. In 431 A.D. the Council of Ephesus denounced Nestorius. The bishops affirmed that Jesus is both fully human and fully divine and proclaimed Mary *Theotokos*. Translating the Greek to English, that means "God-bearer." Note that this isn't "God-generator" or "God-creator." Mary bore Jesus, God and man, in her womb and gave him birth. She is mother to the whole person, the whole Jesus, and therefore Mother of God.

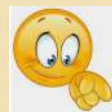
